Don't Ever Say That Again

In A 3rd Serving of Chicken Soup for the Soul, there is a story about a student who was unlike most students. One day in the 11th grade he went into a classroom to wait for a friend. The teacher appeared and asked him to go to the blackboard. He replied, "I'm not one of your students." The teacher said, "Doesn't matter. Go to the board anyhow." The student told him he couldn't do that and when the teacher asked "why not?" the student told him he had been told he had learning issues. The teacher came over to the student and said, "Don't ever say that again. Someone's opinion of you does not have to become your reality."

It became a liberating moment for the student, a time of great learning. The teacher, Mr. Washington, became the student's mentor. Later that school year Mr. Washington addressed the graduating seniors. And in his speech he said, "You have greatness within you You can touch millions of people's lives." After the speech the student went up to Mr. Washington and asked him if he had greatness within him. The teacher replied, "Yes, Mr. Brown, you do." The student thanked him and told him that one day he would make the teacher proud.

In his senior year it happened that Brown was placed in Mr. Washington's speech and drama class. Although Brown was a special education student, the principal realized that this would be a good match up. Mr. Washington gave Brown a larger vision of himself. While other teachers passed Brown from class to class, Mr. Washington made more demands of him. He made him accountable. He enabled him to believe in himself. Years later the famous, Les Brown, produced five specials on public television. Mr. Washington saw the program and called Les Brown to tell him how proud he was of his achievement.

When others believe in us we gain confidence in ourselves and are able to do great things. Naturally, we still have to apply ourselves. Les Brown had to work hard to finish high school. But, he was now motivated to learn. Our children need to hear from us that we believe in them. Our students, who could be our friends, relatives, or co-workers will be motivated to aspire to greater things when we believe in them.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL STEWARDSHIP REPORT

This has been another busy year for the Immaculate Conception St. Vincent de Paul group. As everyone knows, the pantry serves around 140 to 160 families per month. The average cost to keep the pantry stocked is around \$2,000.00 per month. We appreciate all donations and cannot say enough for the help from the school students.

For the week of Thanksgiving the students donated 5,846 lbs. of food, of that 3,521 lbs. was protein! The winning rooms were 7B for collecting 1,055 lbs. of food and 5A for collecting 815 lbs. of protein. Each winning room was awarded their choice of a Pizza party or Chick-fil-A.

We provided 300 families with all the ingredients needed for a Thanksgiving meal and at Christmas provided food for 135 families, 50 of which were families from Sacred Heart Parish. The Sacred Heart families received food needed to prepare a traditional meal of tamales. St. Vincent de Paul was also able to present Father Tom a check for \$4,500.00 to be used for gift cards to be used at his discretion.

We are always in need of volunteers to help bag and distribute food on Monday and Thursday of each week. Feel free to join us every 5th Wednesday to help feed the homeless on Jefferson Avenue.

This pretty much wraps up the year and I would like to thank everyone who found the time to help unload trucks, bag groceries, distribute food etc. Special thanks to the Knights, the Security Team and above all everyone who donated funds to make this all possible. Happy New Year and God Bless.
