#### **STUDY CONFIRMS NEED FOR FATHERS TO TAKE THEIR FAITH SERIOUSLY**

A rather large and important study conducted by the Swiss government in 1994 and published in 2000 revealed some astonishing facts with regard to the generational transmission of faith and religious values. In short, the study reveals: *"It is the religious practice of the father of the family that, above all, determines the future attendance at or absence from church of the children."* 

#### THE STUDY REPORTS (3]:

1. **If both father and mother attend regularly**, 33% of their children will end up as regular churchgoers, and 41% will end up attending irregularly. Only a quarter of their children will end up not practicing at all.

2. **If the father does not regularly attend and the mother regularly attends**, only 3% of the children will subsequently become regulars themselves, while a further 59% will not attend regularly. Thirty-eight percent will be lost.

3. **If the father is non-practicing and mother regularly attends**, only 2% of children will become regular worshippers, and 37% will attend irregularly. Over 60% of their children will be lost completely to the church!

What happens if the father regularly attends but the mother does not or is non-practicing? Amazingly, the percentage of children becoming regular goes up from 33% to 38% with the irregular mother and up to 44% with the non-practicing. This suggests that loyalty to the father's commitment grows in response to the mother's laxity or indifference to religion.

In short, if a father does not go to church -- no matter how faithful his wife's devotions - only one child in 50 will become a regular worshipper. If a father does go regularly, regardless of the practice of the mother, between two-thirds and three-quarters of their children will become churchgoers (regular and irregular). One of the reasons suggested for this distinction is that children tend to take their cues about domestic life from Mom while their conceptions of the world outside come from Dad. If Dad takes faith in God seriously then the message to their children is that God should be taken seriously.

**This confirms the essential role of father as spiritual leader**, which I would argue is true fatherhood. Fathers are to love their wives as Christ loves the church, modeling the love of the Father in their most important earthly relationship. Fathers are to care for their children as our Father in heaven cares for us and finally, fathers play a primary role in teaching their children the truth about reality. It is the father who should instruct his children in their understanding of the world from a consciously and informed Christian worldview. It is the father who is essential for sending his children forth with a biblical view of reality and a faith in Jesus Christ that is rooted in solid understanding.

It is time for fathers to return to honorable manhood and reconsider their priorities and realign them with God's commands, decrees, and laws, teaching these things to your children "when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise" (Deuteronomy 6:7).

#### PROJECTS TO PREPARE FOR THE FUTURE WHEN WE CAN GATHER

- YOUTH ROOM: Removing old furniture, carpet and damaged ceiling tile from the lower level youth room and replacing with a hard surface floor covering. This will provide a clean and pleasant place for our youth to meet and to pray. It will also make the room accessible for our school children during a storm threat.
- **VIDEO PRODUCTION ROOM:** Enlarging the room by four feet to provide for streaming Mass. This will enable us to make use of the WiFi signal to equipment used to connect to our parishioners who are at home and the homebound to pray with us for our celebration of the Eucharist and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
- **CHAPEL:** Removing pews and the deteriorated carpet and replacing the flooring with a hard surface floor and chairs to provide for funerals that have a small attendance, thus allowing the accessibility of bringing a casket into the chapel for the funeral Mass.

This week we will be repairing sections of our parking lot, sealing cracks, sealing and striping our parking lot. The cost of this maintenance to
