

HOLY WEEK

We now enter into the most sacred time of the Church year— Holy Week. We reflect on God's special gift of himself to us in the Eucharist which we commemorate on Holy Thursday during the Mass of the Lord's Supper. On Good Friday we are present with Jesus in his sufferings in Gethsemene. We watch in horror as he is stripped of his garments, scourged, crowned with thorns and condemned to death. At the Easter Vigil observing the blessing of the new fire, we are reminded with the lighting of the Easter Candle that Christ is the light of our lives, and we experience the joy which is expressed in the singing of the Exultet, the Easter proclamation. During the many scripture readings of the Easter Vigil we reflect on the mystery of being called to observe and imagine Jesus whose life, death and resurrection we are called to preach. We will rejoice also with the candidates and catechumens who will enter the Catholic Church during this ceremony. Thus, we will know the joy of Easter people.

We invite and encourage as many parishioners as possible to be present for the services of the Sacred Triduum. Attendance at these beautiful services helps make a Happy Easter a reality. Please plan to attend.

MASS OF CHRISM

You are cordially invited to attend the Mass of Chrism on Tuesday, March 26 at 7:00pm at St. Agnes Cathedral. At this Mass Bishop Rice will bless the holy oils used in the sacraments. Also, the priests of the area will rededicate themselves to their sacred priesthood and renew their allegiance to their bishop. Such an occasion as the Chrism Mass is a great reminder to pray in gratitude for the dedicated priests we have and to pray that many young men will respond to the call to priestly ministry.

DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. All who are 14 or older are required to abstain from meat on Good Friday. Those who are between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound by the law of fast.

PONTIFICAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

Pope Francis has asked our parish to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land, where they are now less than 2% of the population. Your support is essential to help the Church minister in parishes, provide Catholic Schools and offer religious education. This collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines of Christianity, including in Jerusalem, Nazareth, and Bethlehem, to name only a few. The pandemic hit Christians in the Holy land particularly hard. Most of them depend on pilgrimages for work. In these times of crisis, the Pontifical Good Friday Collection is necessary to meet the basic needs of the people of God still living in this Land and to maintain Christian presence where the Church was born. 
