




SUNDAY MASS NURSERY

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION ORGAN RENOVATION PROJECT



Here at Immaculate Conception, we are blessed with a beautiful tradition of exemplary music, whether it is in our choirs, our music ministers, or even the students of our school. One of the most vital tools that enable this ministry to happen is the beautiful Schantz pipe organ, which is prominent in the design of our sanctuary. This prestigious instrument has been serving our parish very well for decades.

As is the nature of this instrument, with the course of time, this utilization during the past forty years

has left many parts of it struggling to hold up to the demands that need to be met, largely within the control console itself. Many integral parts that need to be reliable for the ease of use for the instrument have started to fail, and as a result need to be replaced.

Please note, this is not a replacement of our current pipe organ. Though many things may look new, including the console (the organist's controller for the organ), the pipes and appearance of the organ will remain the same and in use. The inner components and linkage of the organ are what will change. In addition, to add to the current patrimony of the instrument that is here, this renovation will add some resources and sounds that have largely been missing from our organ, including a variety of digital "stops" (or sounds), which even includes digital chimes! It will also implement usability upgrades that will assist in ensuring our organ is easily playable by organists of any skill level, or will even aid young organists who may be learning to play.

The question that likely arises from this is: can we help with this project? The answer: absolutely! We are seeking your help as a parish family to contribute to the success of this project by praying for its success, but also contributing to it financially, if you feel called to do so. This is not simply one project amongst many, but one that will contribute greatly to our worship as a parish family, now, and in generations to come. THE CELEBRATION OF THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

at Immaculate Conception Parish

Holy Thursday (April 14th)- 7:00pm

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament through 12:00am

On Holy Thursday, the Church celebrates Christ's institution of two important sacraments: The Eucharist, and Holy Orders. The Last Supper is the moment in which Jesus offers His Body and His Blood to the Apostles for the first time under the humble appearances of bread and wine and washes their feet to encourage the Apostles to be servants to one another in the priesthood.

At the end of Mass, there is a procession to the Gathering Area where adoration will take place, so that we, like the Apostles, can wait and pray with the Lord in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Good Friday (April 15th)- 12:00pm & 7:00pm

This is the very moment that we've prepared for during Lent. Jesus Christ comes to accept His Cross and dies on Calvary for our sins. We read the Passion narrative, and the liturgy is very quiet and somber. In fact, the liturgy is so somber that priests are forbidden to celebrate the Mass this day, and we wait in shocked silence, experiencing the resolution into the silence that occurs after Jesus pays the price for our sins.

Holy Saturday (April 16th)- 7:00pm

The day has been quiet. Then suddenly, out of that silence, during the night, the tomb bursts open and Christ emerges victorious, showing. He is the light of the world through the Easter fire and candle, and even death cannot hold Him. For the first time since the beginning of Lent, we sing the "Alleluia" to announce this news! Finally, to celebrate the power of this moment, we receive new members into our parish family, as some are baptized, all are confirmed, and then they receive their first communion.

Easter Sunday (April 17th)- 7:00am, 9:00am, 11:00am

The disciples arrive at the tomb, and find that Jesus has risen, as He promised!
